Leader: We are the Body of Christ

All: The Body of Christ, living with HIV

Leader: If we choose, we can make a difference

All: If we choose, we can help bring newness, hope and peace

Leader: In our homes, in our church, in our community, in our nation, in

Leader: Our sisters and brothers, our parents and children are infected with HIV

Reader 1: Today is the first Sunday in Advent, which is a time we prepare for the birth of Jesus. So as the days grow darker we can carry the light of this first candle in our hearts and in our hopes. And this first Sunday is a day of hope.

Reader 2: Today, we start to build our Nativity scene. We begin by placing sheep. Sheep and shepherd are very common themes in our Sacred Writings. In John's Gospel Jesus refers to himself as the good shepherd. And then there is the 23rd Psalm. Moses was a shepherd. So, as we begin our journey to the manger, we must remember that we too are part of a flock, the flock that is called Emmanuel United Church.
