That refuse to stand by when the dignity of our Indigenous brothers and sisters is trampled. Give us healing hearts –

That beat with the drum of Jesus' Gospel, to defend and honour our Indigenous neighbour, their language and way of life.

Give us flaming hearts -

That burn with love for you, who come to us

... in every human face

... in every language and culture ... in every gift of creation.

Make us stewards –

Of one another's dignity,

Of one another's safety,

Of one another's lands,

Of one another's right to a cultural identity: ... as unique peoples,

... as gifts to the human family,

... as your beloved children in Jesus. Amen
